

Mason Dixon Trail

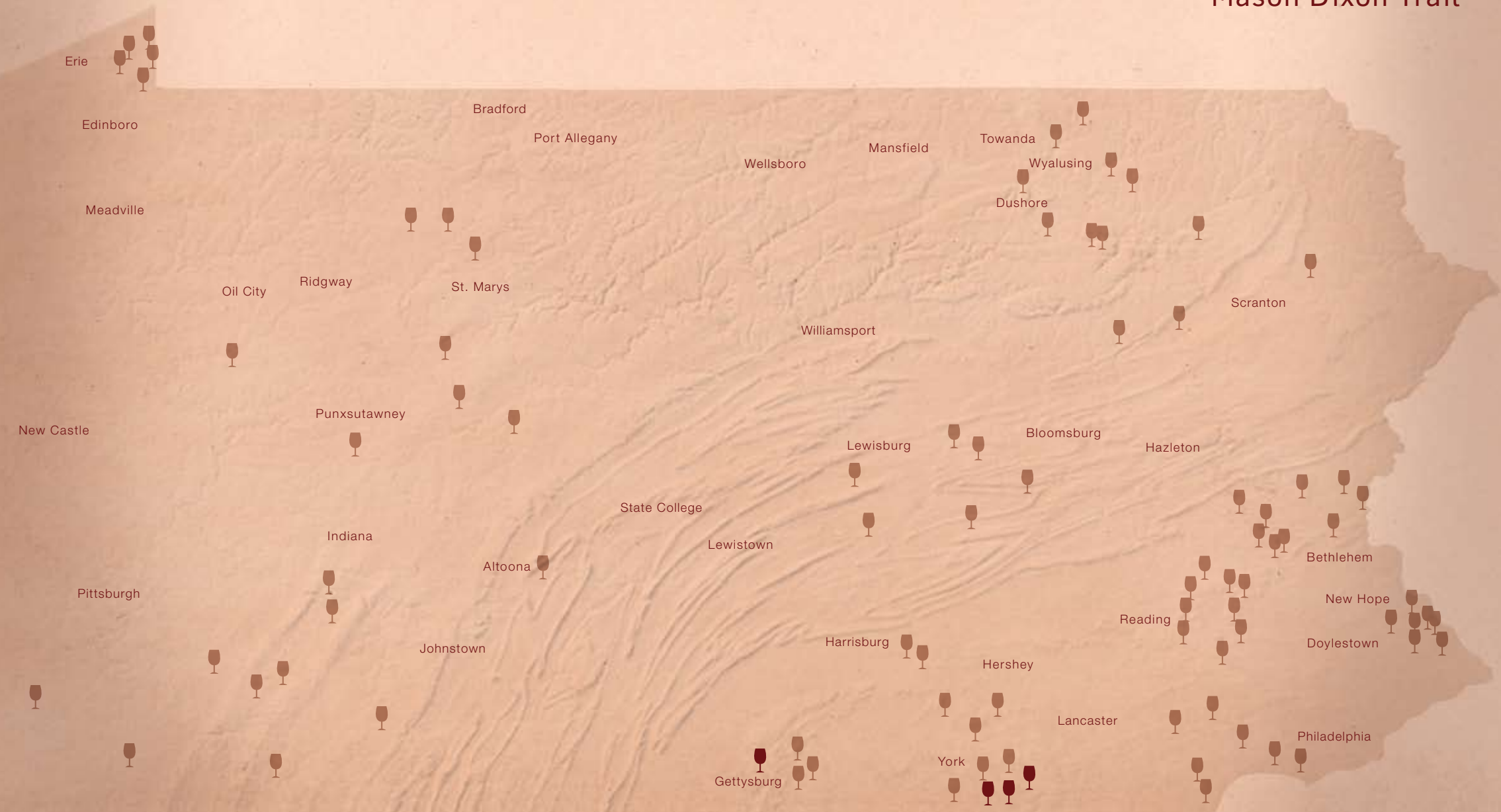
